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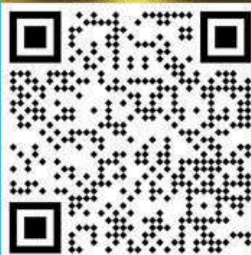

What kind of art do you create, and what does it signify?

I create Visionary Art, which stems from the human need to capture the intangible on canvas. It is a very intimate conversation with the soul—or, one might say, with God. This movement draws roots from Surrealism, Fantastic Art, and Symbolism.

Each artist in this genre undergoes a process of evolution and deep inner work. We require periods of silence to capture a vision and connect with the world of spirits.

Viviane, where are you from, and when did you start painting?

I am from Chile. I am 63 years old, and I began painting at 46. To put it briefly, I had a mystical experience at 46 during which I fell into a coma. To the doctors' astonishment, I woke up. They asked me, "What is the tunnel like?"

A year later, I remembered that I had been on another plane of existence. I had been assigned a task and a purpose on Earth: to paint visionary art—the art of the spiritual world. From that moment on, I began to paint. I have progressed over the years through intense work, study, and a singular dedication to artistic expression.

How does your inspiration arise? Where does your creative process originate?

The process is fluid and effortless for me because I can access an inexhaustible source of imagery through my dreams and by cultivating inner silence through meditation and conscious breathing.

I am also visited by spirits who whisper names to me, leading me to investigate further, or who show me stories from higher planes of consciousness while I sleep. In short, I channel these spiritual worlds to share them with humanity.

Interview

You held an exhibition across various cities in Chile in 2025 titled *Metanoia*. What does this term mean?

Metanoia is a word God whispered in my ear while I was in Spain in 2024. From that moment, I dedicated myself to researching the term, which led to the collection: "*Metanoia: Beyond the Mind.*" Derived from the Greek *meta* (beyond) and *nous* (mind), it describes a profound and radical change in how we think, feel, and perceive reality. It is an inner transformation that alters one's very essence. It is the reconstruction of the psyche—often following an existential crisis—where the individual emerges with a more integrated identity and a new vision of the world.

Your exhibition in Chile and Spain this year is titled *Panpsychism*. Why did you choose this?

The term *Panpsychism* comes from the Greek *pan* (all) and *psyche* (soul/mind). It has ancient roots in *Thales of Miletus* ("everything is full of gods") and has been explored by philosophers like *Spinoza* and *Leibniz*, and more recently by figures in physics and neuroscience.

I chose this title because it represents a philosophical current asserting that all creation possesses consciousness, or the seed of it. Consciousness is a vibrational field that exists both within and outside of us; as humans, we impact and co-create it through our decisions and choices.

It is the union of spirituality and science—specifically physics and quantum mechanics. I have been deeply impacted by *Federico Faggin*, the creator of the microprocessor. I have always felt certain that everything has a spirit. It is the certainty that Consciousness is present at all levels of matter. We are a unified whole, acting as "God's laboratory" and co-creators of wisdom in this great school called Earth.



Finally, how do you approach the canvas? What is your creative process like?

When a creative cycle begins—usually with a phrase or word that touches my soul—I enter a long period of silence. Then, standing before the canvas with no idea of what might emerge, I begin to draw.

The surprise is just as great for me when I see the finished work as it is for those who visit my exhibitions. My art arises from an intimate conversation with silence and with God.

I want to thank this magazine for featuring a Chilean artist on your cover. India is a magical place of profound spirituality that I deeply admire. My home has always been adorned with Lord Ganesha, the protector of the arts and the remover of obstacles.

I am truly grateful.

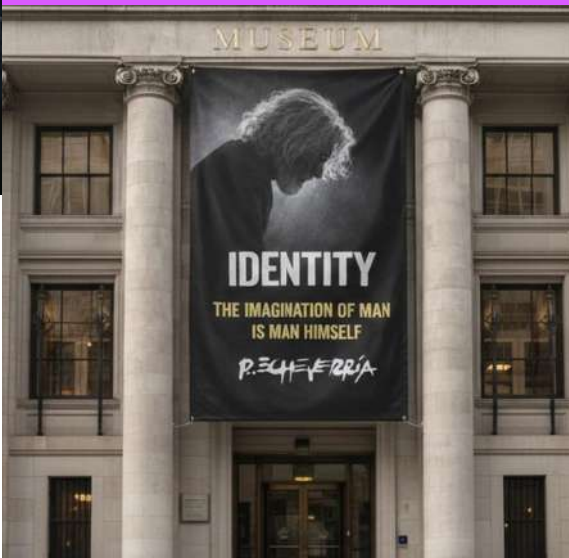
URUGUAY IS EXPERIENCING A RARE CULTURAL PHENOMENON



The tour now enters a particularly significant phase: its integration with the grape harvest, ecotourism, and the landscape. In Sierras de Mahoma, the artwork moves to an environment where art ceases to be mere contemplation and becomes a total experience: stone, horizon, wine, community, and celebration. The choice of the deep interior is not decorative: it is a statement. VUJA DE understands that contemporary culture also happens far from the capital cities, in the real Uruguay, where the land still retains an intact symbolic power.

A contemporary art tour that goes beyond simply exhibiting artwork, building territory, meaning, and community. Under the name **VUJA DE — National Tour 2026**, Uruguayan artist Pablo Echeverría has embarked on a journey that proposes a visual and conceptual reflection on perception, memory, and time, with a clear objective: to take art out of the usual circuit and bring it to settings steeped in history, identity, and nature. The concept of **VUJA DE** — the reverse of *déjà vu* — defines the heart of the project: it is not about “what has already been seen,” but about seeing for the first time what has always been there. The exhibition functions as a conscious interruption of automatism: it unsettles the gaze and transforms the image into a territory of questioning, not answering.

Following its opening in the interior of the country, in an unconventional space transformed into an open-air gallery, the official launch of VUJA DE's 2026 tour was a unique experience at the Old Train Station in Arroyo Grande, a historic building now a sensitive territory, imbued with the atmosphere of the place's memory and that of its people.

At this stage, the project also adds an international dimension: the diplomatic presence, particularly linked to France, introduces a cultural dialogue that moves beyond protocol and embraces lived experience. Ambassadors and representatives experience the proposal firsthand, in direct contact with the landscape and a profoundly Uruguayan celebration: the grape harvest as ritual, tradition, and identity. At this crossroads, contemporary art becomes a bridge: between countries, between languages, between memories.

The movement doesn't stop there. The next stop heralds a continuation laden with symbolism: Nueva Helvecia, in the heart of Uruguay's Swiss community, will be the next venue, with the support of the Swiss Embassy. The choice could not be more eloquent: if Sierras de Mahoma represents ancestral nature and the heart of Uruguay, Nueva Helvecia embodies the migrant legacy, the work ethic, the European tradition integrated into the Americas, and the living memory of a shared identity.

VUJA DE — National Tour 2026 thus unfolds as an expansive and evolving cultural gesture: a project that transforms Uruguay into a dynamic map of art, landscape, and diplomacy. In a time when the cultural world tends to concentrate in large cities, this tour proposes the opposite: to decentralize, open up, mix, inhabit. And, above all, to look anew.

Exhibits Her Transformative Vision of Nature at ERA Gallery

Visual artist Ángeles de la Torre Bravo has unveiled an exhibition at the ERA Gallery in San Fernando, Cádiz (Spain), inviting reflection on the relationship between humanity and nature—viewed here as a living force capable of transforming the seemingly immutable. The exhibition features a series of works exploring concepts such as the home reclaimed by vegetation, symbolizing how nature deconstructs and redefines our world's internal structures. Alongside this, De la Torre revives the archetype of Mother Nature and the prehistoric goddess as the origin of life—a figure marginalized by the rise of the warrior god and the onset of a patriarchy that persists today.

The show also references the prehistoric cult of the bucranium, associated with the womb and its creative power, and includes drawings inspired by the poetry of Miguel Hernández, where the bond between human and nature forges a unique, deeply symbolic cosmogony. Ultimately, the body of work expresses a dual commitment: the defense of the natural world and the care of people through respect for identity, culture, and peaceful coexistence.

In Collaboration with Mel Appleton

Tell us about your debut in *Rush* with Chris Hemsworth and Olivia Wilde. What was that experience like?

Rush was a quiet initiation. Being on set with Chris Hemsworth and Olivia Wilde, guided by Ron Howard's steady hand, showed me what discipline looks like when it wears confidence lightly. There was no chaos masquerading as genius - just preparation, clarity, and people who understood the responsibility of scale. I remember feeling two things at once: small, and completely certain that I belonged in that world. That duality is healthy. It keeps you learning without shrinking you. Effortlessness on a set like that isn't accidental - it's earned. And witnessing that standard early on didn't intimidate me; it calibrated me.

What is the initial seed of your stories?

It often begins with a quiet fracture - a moment where a character must choose between who they are and what would be easier. I'm drawn to those internal crossroads where integrity isn't convenient.

Sometimes it starts with an image: a man holding something delicate in a landscape that has forgotten how to be gentle. From there, the emotional architecture builds itself. I trust those images. They tend to know more than I do at the beginning.

How would you define the visual tone of your films?

Gritty poetic realism. I favor natural light, restrained palettes, and environments that feel inhabited rather than designed. I don't believe the camera needs to announce itself. It should witness with intention. There's strength in understatement. When you allow stillness to exist, it reveals character.

I'm not interested in overwhelming an audience; I'd rather invite them closer. The quiet moments are often where truth lives.

Can you tell us something about your film *The Butterfly Keeper*?

The Butterfly Keeper is a World War II drama centered on conscience under pressure. At its heart, it asks what remains of innocence when the world demands compromise. The butterfly represents fragility, yes - but also resilience. Something delicate surviving brutality carries a certain grace. The story isn't driven by spectacle; it's driven by moral weight. War may be loud, but the decisions that define us are often made in silence.

What advice would you give to an emerging filmmaker trying to direct their first feature film today?

Stay steady. Rejection is part of the terrain, not a verdict. The industry tests endurance more than inspiration.

Learn the craft from every angle - budgets, blocking, editing, psychology. Respect the crew. Finish what you start. Completion builds credibility, even when perfection isn't yet within reach. If you can continue creating without applause, you're building something that lasts.

How do you see the evolution of cinematic language with the rise of streaming platforms?

Streaming has shifted pacing and access. Stories engage earlier now; attention must be earned quickly. At the same time, long-form storytelling has expanded in ways that allow deeper character exploration.

The environment has changed, but the heart of cinema hasn't. Audiences still respond to authenticity. They still lean toward sincerity. Technology may accelerate consumption, but emotional truth remains patient.



Fashion is also an important part of your artistic career. Do you have any more projects planned in that area?

Fashion, to me, is narrative distilled. Structure, silhouette, texture - they speak before dialogue ever does. I'm drawn to minimalism with intention, pieces that feel considered rather than decorative. Whether it becomes a formal collection or remains an extension of my creative identity, it follows the same principle as my films: clarity, restraint, presence. Style doesn't need excess to be memorable. Sometimes the most compelling thing in the room is the one that isn't trying too hard - it simply knows itself.

Einar Haraldsson

Fall 2: In this sequel to the 2022 survival thriller, Haraldsson plays the role of Joe.

Reykjavik: A historical drama centered on the 1986 summit between Reagan and Gorbachev. Haraldsson is part of the USSR negotiating team.

Television (2026)

Hildur: He appears in this series (based on the noir novels by Satu Rämö), playing an airplane passenger in the episode titled "Kaksi harjoittelijaa."

Recently, the actor has also gained notoriety for his work in 2025 productions such as *Sisu*, *Road to Revenge* and *Stay Safe*.

Beyond film, Nuza is an accomplished author. His publications include *Promises: The Mason Ordeal* (Minerva Press, 2002) and *Promises: Emily's Harrowing Story* (Best Publishing, UK), in addition to his acclaimed crime screenplay and novel *Snatched: The Unforgettable Cruise*.

Strength and Fitness Coach



"I became a mother when most girls my age were still in college, and one casual "aunty" comment on my postpartum body hit me harder than any weight I have ever lifted. I was just 20–21, but extra kilos and zero guidance made me feel much older than I was. With no coach, no mentor, and no idea how to even walk into a gym, I decided to become my own guide. I started reading, learning what weight training is, why women over 30 must lift to protect their bones, boost metabolism, balance hormones, and stay strong for life, instead of fearing it will "damage the spine" when in reality, with proper form, it actually builds bone density, core strength, and keeps the back safer and more resilient."

"From there, the girl once called "aunty" became Simran—the woman who rides bikes, drives a Thar, snatches and clean & jerks, trains men in their own homes, and still comes back to hug her daughter goodnight. As a Marwari woman who chose the gym floor over "log kya kahenge," I challenged family expectations, broke every rule that tried to shrink me, and turned my struggle into a mission to help others lose fear, gain strength, and finally look and feel like the age and power".

BUGONIA'S REVIEW

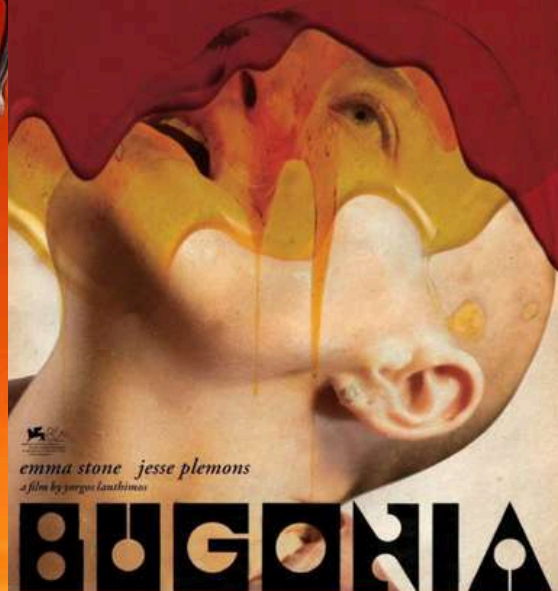


Bugonia is an American science fiction thriller and black comedy film directed by Yorgos Lanthimos and written by Will Tracy. It is an English-language remake of the 2003 South Korean film *Save The Green Planet!*, directed by Jang Joon-hwan.

It was released in November 2025 and has a running time of 1 hour 59 minutes. Yorgos Lanthimos is a Greek director known for his provocative films and absurd style, establishing himself internationally with multiple awards and Oscar nominations. His work combines black humour, social criticism and strange narratives.

The film tells the story of two men obsessed with conspiracy theories who kidnap an influential CEO of a technology company, convinced that she is an alien. The situation exposes their beliefs, psychological tensions and the ambiguity about what really happens during the confinement and their constant interrogations.

Bugonia relates to the ancient myth of *bugonia* as a central metaphor. Just like the belief that bees are spontaneously born from the sacrificed ox. The film shows a context of paranoia and social decadence from which new interpretations of reality emerge, reflecting processes of transformation, symbolically linking deterioration, crisis and the possibility of renewal. References to bees reinforce this symbolic idea.

The photography is characterised by precise framing, symmetrical compositions and the use of enclosed spaces that generate a constant sense of tension and alienation. The sober lighting and cool tones contribute to creating a restrained aesthetic that emphasises the disturbing nature of the narrative.

The set design plays a fundamental role in the construction of the narrative, with much of the action taking place in confined interiors, especially in the space where the protagonist is being held captive. This environment is designed with few elements and an austere layout, which accentuates the feeling of isolation and control.

The performances of Emma Stone and Jesse Plemons are characterised by a restrained tone and minimal gestures, a common device used by the director. This acting style, together with a slow pace and prolonged silences, reinforces the disturbing and absurd nature of the story, provoking feelings of anxiety and suspense in the viewer.

In conclusion, *Bugonia* confirms Lanthimos' distinctive style, combining precise aesthetics, claustrophobic set design and restrained performances to construct a disturbing, absurd and symbolically rich narrative that explores decadence, paranoia and human transformation.

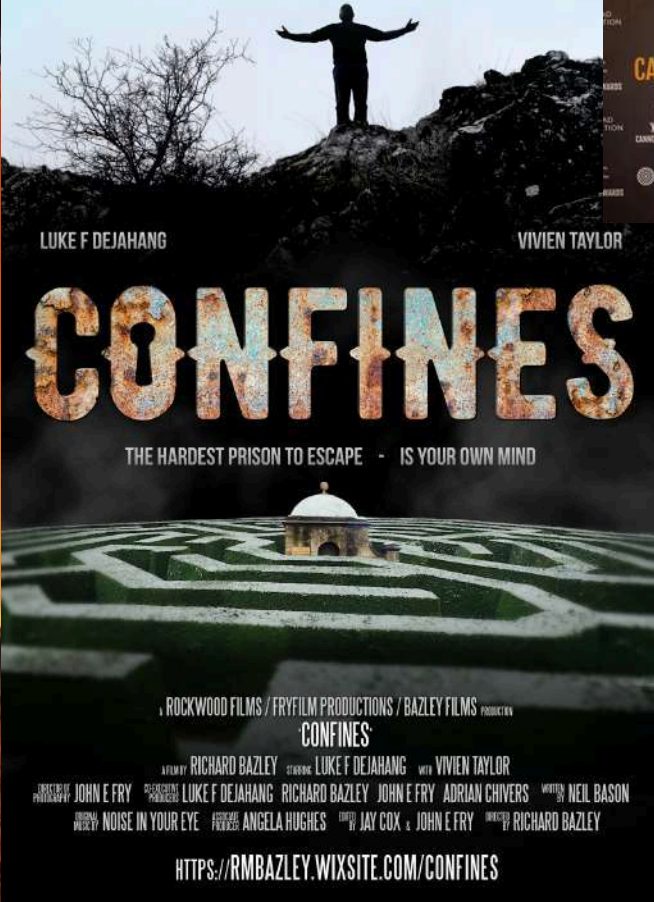

His inner voices too are visualised. He beats himself up and as we travel through his journey with him we find out more and more about his journey and why he is tormented. Inner voices are rarely positive. We talk to ourselves in a way we would never talk to other people often reinforcing negative self images which can be very self destructive.

As his voices berate him he tries to escape but like many of us, he gets caught up, tangled and lost, in the maze of his mind. I was watching a Netflix documentary the other week in which a famous actor interviews his psychiatrist. It is brilliant. The therapist brought up the same analogy and said we all get caught in 'the maze' and did a crude but effective sketch of a maze and an arrow straight past it. What you have to do, he said, is move forward. Always move forward and don't get stuck in the maze. It was obvious once he said it but still a revelation to me. I will never get stuck in that maze again!

In a way, making Confines was a therapy session! The story is Neil Bason's, my long term collaborator. I told him about the Blind House and said.

“What if a man is trapped in his mind and we show that visually?”

Neil jumped on it and took it from there with some of the most exquisite dialogue delivered with immense intensity by Luke F Dejahang. Listen to this. You will hear these lines in the trailer below.

“Anxiety bites hard! The clamp on the chest and the gut punch! It comes in kicking! It doesn't screw about with etiquette or introductions! It comes in kicking! When the attacks started, 'Fight or Flight' I was Icarus forever spirally without control. And then , in a rare moment of glassier fresh clarity, I saw my escape plan!”

Amazing words from screenwriter Neil Bason. A gift for both actor and director! It all rings so true, I am thinking that some true life experiences are being played out for real.

Also do notice how master cinematographer John E Fry has lit the anxiety scenes in red. Colours reflect mood.

Again I won't give away too much. All I will say is we don't have to give in to our demons. Watch Confines. Hopefully you will be entertained, but even better inspired. Bless you all! And whatever you do , do not beat yourselves up! It's all a passing show.

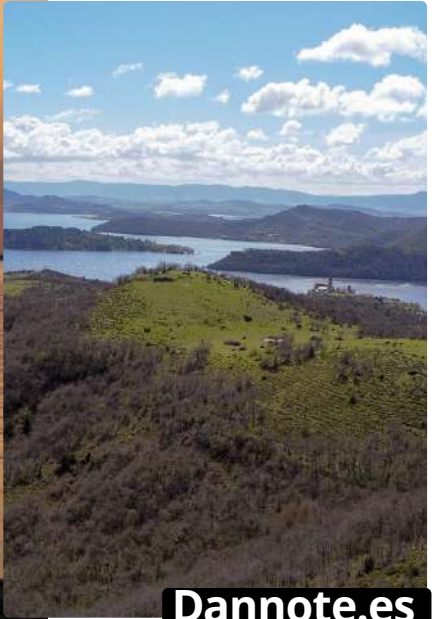
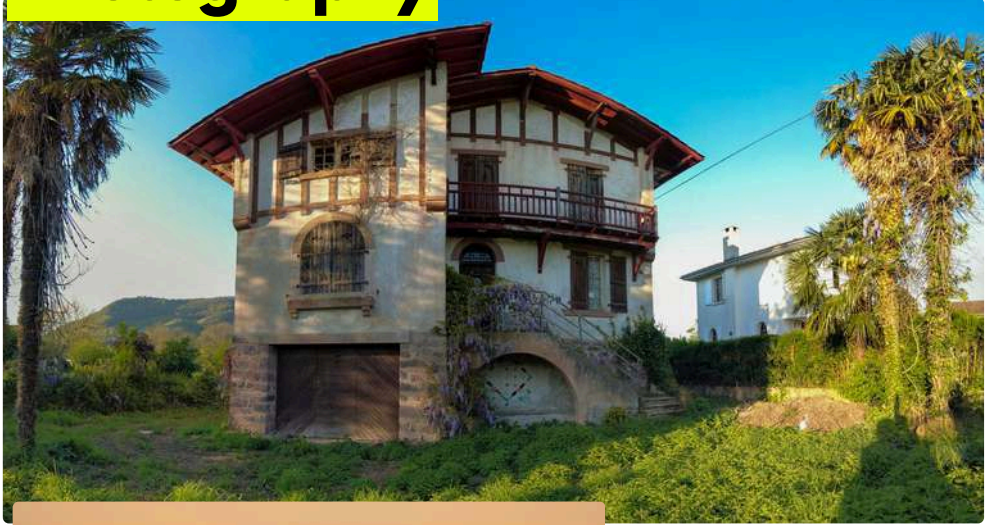
